ROC encourages learners to build on existing or develop new skills whilst maintaining links with family and friends.

ROC's Work to Work Programme

As a ROC College student you can enrol on ROC's Work to Work Programme where you can work towards your Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Awards.

These awards will support you to develop the skills necessary for sustainable voluntary or paid work, whether that be part or full time. ROC can also assist you by providing a personalised Internship Programme or support you to gain your Duke of Edinburgh Awards.



Wellbeing Services

Aspects is based in Paignton and is a dedicated service aimed at building independence through training and qualifications. Sessions include; IT, budgeting and cooking, accessing the community and travel training.

Lower Sharpham Barton Farm and Boscawen Farm are

based in Totnes and Cornwall. The farms provide opportunities for adults with learning disabilities to achieve land-based skills and qualifications in horticulture, animal care and wood and metal work. **ROC Creative** are dedicated Arts Projects based in Paignton and Honiton which supports adults with learning disabilities to express themselves through a variety of media. We have specialist practitioners running groups in art and design, drama, photography, film and music.

ROC Active is based in Torbay and Exeter and provides a number of sporting activities such as volleyball, badminton, swimming and also provides tailor made gym sessions. ROC Active aims to encourage healthy and active lifestyles.
